• Where is St. Patrick's Day celebrated?

What are some traditions and symbols related to St. Patrick's Day?

There are many fun traditions related with St' Patrick's day in Ireland! People traditionally wear green clothes because green is the colour that we associate with Ireland. People go to watch and take part in the parades in their local city. These parades are full of traditional Irish music and dance. Children paint their faces. Famous sights are turned green or with green lights for the day, for example, the main river, The Liffey, in the capital city, Dublin, is turned green.
